Angling Road School applied for and received a three year grant to receive positive behavior support training for our staff through the Michigan Integrated Behavior and Learning Support Initiative. Many schools throughout the state are working with MiBLSi teams through local Intermediate School Districts and Angling Road is now a MiBLSi school. With 100% of our staff involved, we have worked diligently to develop clear behavioral expectations for all students in their classrooms, hallways, assemblies, with guest teachers, bathrooms, cafeteria, and playground. All staff are committed to telling, teaching, modeling, watching, encouraging and supporting all students to maximize learning and character development. Behavior and academic success are intimately connected and need to be intelligently addressed together – Angling Road School is a high performing school with amazing children!

THINGS PARENTS NEED TO KNOW...

1. LOADS OF FORMS will go home on the 1st day of school! Please send completed forms to school by September 9th. Questions call the office.

- **STUDENT INFORMATION SHEET/EMERGENCY DISMISSAL FORM—** Update & complete including phone numbers, cell numbers, allergies, addresses, daycare numbers, medical information, Emergency contacts, and important student information.
- **FREE & REDUCED LUNCH FORM—**Forms were mailed to each household. Please complete one form for your family and return by September 9, 2009.
- **MEDICATION AUTHORIZATION FORMS –**Complete if your son/daughter is taking medications (prescription or over-the-counter) during school hours. These forms are located in the back of the Elementary Handbook.
- **ANGLING ROAD SCHOOL DIRECTORY INFORMATION--**Complete & return by September 9, 2009 (1/2 sheet PINK)
- **ELEMENTARY HANDBOOK with CODE OF CONDUCT & INTERNET USAGE FORM: Code of Conduct/Internet Usage Form for new students, Kindergarten & Young Fives Only. This is in the back of the Elementary Handbook.** Students must have these forms on file in order to participate in various activities, including ANY technology/computer work in the lab!
- **STUDENT INSURANCE LETTER AND FORM** if you would like to take advantage of this insurance program.

2. STUDENT ABSENCES must be called in to the school office (323-6000). We have an answering machine and expect parents to call if your son/daughter is home due to illness, special appointments, and/or special circumstances. ***Please include your child's illness symptoms as we document illnesses (H1N1) to the health department.*** All students are expected to attend school each day and if absent, students must be accounted for. Please call 323-6000 in order to ensure your student's safety and Angling Road attendance policies. Required attendance records are taken by 8:50 a.m. each day. Please contact the office, 323-6000, when your student is absent from school.

3. BREAKFAST/LUNCHES/MILK/SNACKS - Breakfast costs are \$1.20, Lunch costs are \$1.80, and additional Milk costs are \$0.45. All adult lunches are \$2.75. If you prefer to pay by check, please send checks on Mondays for several lunches, in an envelope clearly marked with your child's name, teacher's name, amount enclosed, & numbers of lunches/milks purchased. Mrs. Lauri Johnson, Kitchen Manager, keeps financial accounts for all students. Contact her at ljohnson@portageps.org with questions. Portage Public Schools Food Services will be provided by Chartwells School Dining. Elementary breakfast and lunch menus for September as well as the Chartbusters sack lunch menu will be sent home on the first day of school. Students will have 4 daily lunch choices; the first two items are listed in order on the menu with items 3-4 being served every day.

4. MEDICATION DISTRIBUTION IN SCHOOL: Whenever possible, we encourage parents/guardians to administer medication to children at home. In order to administer medications at school, written consent and instruction from a licensed practitioner and a parent/guardian is required for any type of medication (prescribed AND over-the-counter) to be administered at school. Authorization/Consent must be given on a Portage Public Schools Medication Prescriber/Parent Authorization Form. All medication must be brought to school in the original container with the child's name, drug & dosage, time & quantity to be given and physician's name and duration of treatment on the container's label. **Angling Road staff will NOT provide any antiseptic ointments, lotions, or cough drops to students. We are only able to encourage a child to wash up a bump or scrape and provide an adhesive bandage. Parents will be contacted as appropriate according to the injury, etc. Under no circumstances will a student be given medication or allowed to take medication without written consent from a physician and parent/guardian.**

5. BIRTHDAY TREATS, LATEX BALLOONS, FOOD ALLERGIES, PETS AT SCHOOL, AND HOLIDAY/CLASSROOM PARTIES!

- **BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS AT SCHOOL:** *If your son/daughter would like to bring in birthday treats for his/her class, we ask that children bring a small gift for each student rather than cupcakes, cookies, etc. **We have many children in each classroom with potentially serious food allergies so we consider this a serious safety issue.** (see **Food Allergies information written below.**) In order to assure that students are safe at school and all students may celebrate together, we ask that **NO baked goods, frozen treats, or food items of any kind be sent for birthday celebrations. Each grade level will send home a letter with details about birthday celebrations!** Children always make cards, sing "Happy Birthday" & have their name/birthday announced!*
- **NO LATEX BALLOONS AT ANGLING ROAD –** *It is estimated that between 8,800 and 53,000 Michigan school children could have latex sensitivity. Allergic reactions to latex can range from mild to life threatening. Angling Road currently has students who are allergic to latex. Because of this and the increased incidence in latex sensitivity, **NO latex balloons are allowed in the school building.** Please do not bring balloons to school for your child's birthday for the above concerns. As precautions, we use non-latex gloves & bandages in our health room and all science curriculum related materials are latex free material.*
- **FOOD ALLERGIES, ESPECIALLY PEANUTS AND TREE NUTS –** *Severe food allergies are becoming more and more prevalent in children. Severe reactions can occur due to contact, inhalation and/or ingestion of the allergen. Reactions to specific foods can range from rashes & hives to anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a reaction that leads to difficulty breathing, a drop in blood pressure and shock which are potentially fatal. **Over***

*150 deaths per year occur from food anaphylaxis, mostly from peanut and tree nut allergies. At Angling Road Elementary, we have a number of children with life-threatening food allergies, particularly to peanuts and tree nuts. If exposed to peanuts/nuts these students may develop a life-threatening allergic reaction requiring immediate medical treatment. The most important aspect of managing food allergies is avoidance and prevention. To assist these students in being safe at school, we have developed specific procedures, including having students wash their hands regularly and the establishment of two “peanut free” tables in the cafeteria. **Please avoid sending peanuts/peanut snacks for your son/daughter to eat in the classroom during snack times or during lunch times.** We appreciate your support of these procedures and understanding of the challenges these students and their families have in dealing with extreme food allergies. Thank you for your cooperation and feel free to contact Karen Witvoet, Principal, with any questions you may have.*

- **PETS AT SCHOOL:** *Due to student and staff allergies, we are asking that NO PETS be brought to school for Show & Tell or any type of classroom visit. We have many students who need to leave the classroom if student pets are visiting. In addition, please do not bring pets into the building when dropping off your students or picking them up at the end of the day. Teachers will not be able to have classroom pets in their classrooms. We appreciate your support!*
- **HOLIDAY/CLASSROOM PARTIES -** *Teachers have general classroom party information and will talk with Room Parents about classroom party plans. On October 30th, 2:15 p.m., we will have our annual Halloween All School Parade with class parties to follow. As a building, all classrooms will participate in service related projects in the months of November and December. We will support Portage Community Outreach Center with food donations; Adopt A Family projects, Angel Tree contributions, etc. As a building, we will celebrate how you have helped others during these months and consider these great projects in lieu of classroom holiday parties. We will also have an all-school movie in December! Valentines Day will be celebrated on Friday, February 12th. The End of the Year Celebration will be our 3rd annual all-school Field Day. We will provide lots of information in the spring about this exciting time for all students to celebrate the end of a great school year.*

6. ALL DOORS ARE LOCKED (except the main office door) each day. **Doors will remain locked throughout the school day. Your understanding of this safety precaution is greatly appreciated. ALL PARENTS & VISITORS MUST REPORT TO THE OFFICE USING THE MAIN OFFICE DOOR, SIGN IN, AND RECEIVE A VISITORS BADGE. Thank you!**

7. STUDENT ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL: **The elementary school day begins at 8:35 a.m. Students should not arrive on school grounds prior to 8:30 a.m. Afternoon students may arrive at 12:33 p.m. with student safeties supervising students until 12:39 p.m. when school begins. Students who arrive prior to these times will be unsupervised; we are always concerned for student safety and would appreciate your cooperation in this matter.**

8. ANGLING ROAD 5th SAFETY PATROL: **Mr. Ben Hutchins & Mr. Nic Wight are the Teacher Sponsors for this terrific group! Our Safety Patrol will be posted at both east entrances of the school, bus loop, office entrance, & various posts inside the building.**

9. BIKE RIDERS, ROLLERBLADERS, SCOOTER RIDERS-- Students in Grades 1-5 who wish to ride bikes, rollerblades or scooters to & from school must fill out a permission slip with parent signature & return to school. Bikes, scooters, and rollerblades may not be used on school grounds. We have a bike/scooter rack at the east entrance of the school.

10. TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION is available on the Portage Public School web page. Please note that changes in bussing can only be made with advance **WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION from parents/guardians and approval from the Transportation Dept.** If your son/daughter is going home on the bus with a friend, bus notes from parents must be provided 24 hours in advance.

11. VOLUNTARY STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE FOR 2009-2010 SCHOOL YEAR. The Portage Board of Education make available a voluntary student accident insurance program. Parents are able to take advantage of the inexpensive policy for school age children. This program will help families defray the cost of rising family health and dental insurance costs, increased deductibles and co-pays and an alternative for claims due to accidental injuries that unfortunately occur on school property, both during and after school hours. **A detailed brochure & enrollment forms will be sent home.**

12. Notice of Rose Pest Solutions Treatments: Due to Acts 636 & 637 of the Michigan State Department of Agriculture's Pesticide notification of schools, we are required to inform you of scheduled pest control service days. The following is a list of service dates (after school hours) for the 2009-2010 school year. September 1, October 6, November 3, December 1, January 5, February 2, March 2, April 6, May 4, June 1, July 6, August 3.

13. Thank you for providing school supplies for your children. Your child's teacher will provide a supply list this week for 1st semester and another list just before 2nd semester.
