ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

Are you a registered voter? If not, the registration deadline to vote in the Nov. 6 election is Oct. 9. Visit your city or township clerk or any Secretary of State office to register. While there, you can also request an absentee ballot if you will need one.

Also, remember to have your photo ID with you on Nov. 6. This is the first election where voters will be asked to show a photo ID or sign a statement saying they don't have a photo ID.

BOARD REACTS TO COMMUNITY INPUT - After listening to community concerns about linkage between Proposal 1 and Proposal 2, the Board of Education approved a resolution removing the connection between the two at its Sept. 24 meeting. Prop 1 and Prop 2 are now two separate ballot issues standing on their own.

TARDINESS & POOR ATTENDANCE SPELL T-R-O-U-B-L-E

When your child is absent from school, he misses more than the day's lessons. Class discussions can be just as valuable.

If your child is truly sick, he/she should stay home, of course. But missing school for any other reason can become a bad habit. Studies show that kids who have poor attendance in the elementary years are much more likely to drop out of high school later.

You can show your child how important you think good attendance is. Schedule doctors' appointments, haircuts, shopping, and family vacations after school hours.

If your child must stay home due to illness, ask the teacher if assignments can be sent home.

Keeping up with schoolwork will make things easier when he returns.

Finally...remind your child that going to school is their number one job!

ZERO TOLERANCE – The Portage Public Schools impose serious disciplinary action for major misconduct. The Board of Education has adopted the enforcement of a “Zero Tolerance” policy in dealing with students who use profanity, who are engaged in substance abuse, or who display harassing, intimidating, or violent behavior towards other people. The *Code of Student Conduct* is included in your student Handbook, **please take time to read it thoroughly** and review the described consequences with your student. Zero tolerance means the consequences will be enforced as described in this code.

ACCEPTABLE USE AGREEMENT – If you have not signed one yet please do so soon. This agreement is explained in the Portage Public School Handbook given to each child on the first day of school. Failure to turn in a signed agreement will result in your child not being able to use the computer lab.

RECORDS DAY - Friday, November 2nd, is Records Day, there is no school for students.

HALLOWEEN PARADE – Our annual Halloween parade will take place on October 31st at 2:30. Morning Young Fives and Kindergarten students will parade at 10:30.

LAKE CENTER P.T.O. FAMILY DIRECTORY will be distributed soon. This directory is funded by the P.T.O. One copy per family will be sent home, and we hope you find it useful.

STUDENT ARRIVAL - When your child arrives at school after 8:43A.M., please stop at the office first and sign in. Otherwise, you may receive a call that your child is absent because attendance slips have already been sent to the office. We have been having a number of students

dropped off at the back side door (by Mrs. Champion's room). Please do not continue to do so, as it is interfering with the bus drop off that is done there. Thank you for your cooperation.

HEALTH PROBLEMS - If your child has a specific health problem that may need special attention, please notify the office so proper attention may be given.

GYM SHOES - A reminder to parents that children are asked to have a pair of gym shoes for their class. If you cannot provide a pair, please contact the school. Donations of used gym shoes will be appreciated - please send them to school.

BUSES - Our buses are at or near capacity so we will not be able to issue bus passes for parties, play dates or scout meetings. Please make other arrangements for your child.

CHANGING WEATHER CONDITIONS - At this time of the year, temperatures fluctuate rapidly during the day. Please be sure your child comes to school dressed for any type of weather that may occur. We do take a half hour recess each day during the noon hour, and barring rain or severe cold, all children are expected to go out for that recess.

WEATHER ALERT - If we have a weather watch or warning, please stay tuned to your TV or radio for school closings. Please do not call the school. We need to keep our lines open for calls from the Administration offices.

SCHOOL VISITS - The staff at Lake Center wishes to extend a continuous "Welcome" to parents to visit their school and observe their children. However, I ask that you not ask for the teacher's time and attention when they are responsible for and needed by twenty-some children. (This includes when the children are entering the classroom in the A.M. and dismissed in the P.M.) Teachers get caught in the dilemma of either being impolite to you or ignoring their students. It is very important that they use this time to attend to the needs of their students and help monitor hall traffic. After dismissal is a much more relaxing time to talk--either in person or on the telephone. Thanks for your cooperation!

VISITORS' BADGES -Portage Public Schools requires all visitors to wear a nametag that has been made especially for that building. So when you visit please put on a nametag after you have signed in, and please return the badge when you sign out.

FALL CONFERENCES - As we begin to lay the groundwork for conferences, we ask your cooperation with the following:

- We are happy to send a second copy of conference reports and report cards to parents not living in the home. However, it is extremely difficult for us to schedule double conferences. If at all possible, we ask that you arrange to conference jointly or consider alternately attending Fall and Winter Conferences.
- Please make every effort to keep your scheduled conference time. It is very difficult to make up missed appointments.
- If something unexpected comes up and you are unable to make your conference, please notify the teacher as soon as possible so your conference can be rescheduled.
