



## ROXANNE RUBLESKI KOOLE ATHLETE – CLASS OF 1978

One of the first great female athletes of the 1970's, Roxanne Rubleski played a big part in two programs which had great success: softball & basketball. Playing during a time when PCHS was grades 10-12, Roxanne helped the Mustangs make their first (and only) basketball quarter final appearance. Roxanne continued to excel in basketball earning two all-conference awards. In softball, Roxanne made her athletic mark, earning All-Conference Honors, and starring on the Mustang's state championship team. Known for having a rocket arm, Roxanne continued at WMU as their starting catcher for all 4 years, and help lead the Broncos to a MAC title and two College World Series appearances.

Biggest thrill in athletics: *"winning the state championship in softball & winning the district & regional basketball games"*.
